

In our fast-paced and technology driven world, headlines like these often flicker across our screens, catching our attention momentarily before fading into the background of our busy lives. These seemingly mundane news snippets however hold profound depth that we often overlook.

Indifference towards societal issues can create a false sense of normalcy, blinding us to the deeper issues that demand our collective attention. This article seeks to shed light on the danger of indifference, urging us to recognize that societal wellbeing is not just about "you" or "me" but about "us" as a unified force working towards a more compassionate society.

engage in increasingly severe criminal activities. Addressing the normalization of crimes requires a multi-faceted approach that involves media literacy, community engagement and systematic efforts to address the root cause of criminal behaviour. The society as one unit should actively work towards fostering a culture that upholds the value of justice, morality and the rule of law. Only through a collective effort can we hope to build a society where criminal activities are unequivocally condemned rather than accepted as a regrettable norm.
