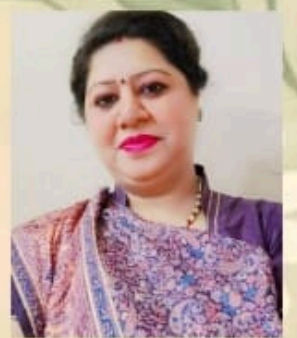

And in the remarks column, I would write just one line:

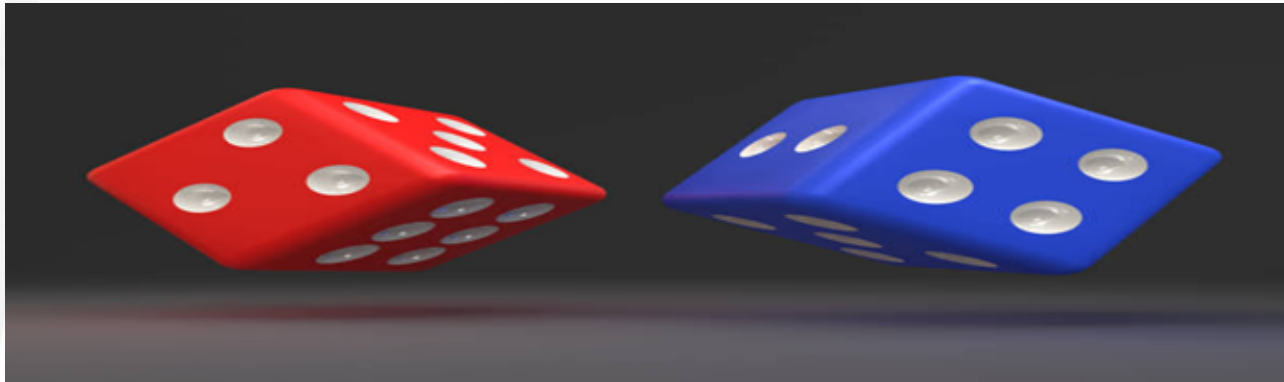
"Thank you to the teachers who are shaping not only capable students, but responsible, compassionate, and remarkable human beings."
